Pine Bluff Area Transportation Study (PBATS) Organization

The Pine Bluff Area Transportation Study Area (PBATS) Program was initiated in 1964 in accordance with the Federal Highway Act of 1962. The intent of the program was to provide a network of transportation facilities capable of providing safe, convenient, effective, and efficient movement of goods and persons throughout the urbanized portion of Jefferson County. Southeast Arkansas Regional Planning Commission was designated by the Governor as the Metropolitan Planning Organization for PBATS.

MPO administration and support are provided by Larry Reynolds, Study Director; Vickie White, Chief Financial Officer; the MPO Policy Committee and a Technical Advisory Committee. The MPO Policy Committee is responsible for providing guidance and setting policies for the PBATS program. The Technical Advisory Committee which is comprised of persons concerned with area-wide transportation planning and is responsible for providing technical assistance in the collection and evaluation of data.

44.21 PROGRAM SUPPORT AND ADMINSITRATION

Comparison of Goals to Performance

This UPWP project comprised 9 categories of work resulting in 11 end products. In cooperation with ArDOT, local governmental agencies, public transit agencies and interested citizens PBATS coordinated meetings with the MPO Policy Board and Technical Advisory Committee. Various staff activities undertaken during FY 2022 include: 1) financial management, 2) administration, 3) records maintenance, 4) document preparation, 5) staff training, 6) community and member training, 7) Public Participation Plan documentation, 8) planning assistance, and 9) Intergovernmental review.

Results of these actions include a) audit report, b) financial and performance reports – a minimum of quarterly, c) FY 2023 UPWP, d) website maintenance, e) planning assistance, and f) Annual Performance and Expenditure report (APER).

44.22 GENERAL DEVELOPMENT AND COMPREHENSIVE PLANNING

Five tasks were defined in this project. These include map review and updating, GIS development, socioeconomic and land use data review, land use and transportation planning coordination.

City maps and MTP area maps were reviewed and updated. Land use maps were being updated through Comprehensive Plan development. Arkansas Department of Transportation (ArDOT) traffic counts were reviewed for intersections, transportation planning review and 2045 MTP maintenance Coordination of ArcMap and ArcGIS mapping programs with Office of Emergency Services was continued. Demographics and census data were reviewed by staff during FY 2022 along with 2020 decennial census data. Building permits (both construction and demolition) were evaluated monthly for the City of Pine Bluff and as occurring for the City of White Hall. County data was evaluated monthly; however, since the county has no building permit process, staff relied on the County Office of Emergency Management's list of new and removed addresses (9-1-1 database) and then verified with the County Health Department. Staff conducted reviews of crash and accident data and is continuing to work with local jurisdictions on converting to a centralized accident reporting system such as eCrash to benefit state-wide incident analysis.

44.23 LONG RANGE PLANNING

Staff coordinated with the Arkansas Department of Transportation (ArDOT) to update and maintain the 2045 MTP throughout the fiscal year. The 2045 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) plan adopted in September of 2020 and amended in March 2021 was reviewed and projects included were evaluated to determine if change in rankings were needed. During review areas of the plan that may need amending to better reflect the Urban Area's current and future transportation were studied.

Four meetings were held with local officials to begin work on a Regional Bike and Pedestrian Plan for the MPO area. Our agency along with bike enthusiasts and local officials met with a Little Rock consultant to obtain an overview of the process from needs analysis to plan development.

SEARPC worked with Pine Bluff Transit on possibilities for route expansion as well as a possible deviated fixed route system. During these discussions it was determined that the agency's fleet was not at a level to make changes due to an aging fleet, lack of personnel and delays in vehicle delivery; therefore, we assisted in the drafting of a Request for Proposals to outsource maintenance.

SEARPC continues to participate through ArDOT with all in-state MPO's to facilitate a more coordinated and consistent transportation planning process state-wide.

44.24 SHORT RANGE PLANNING

Tasks identified for FY2022 were divided among three separate categories. Traffic data, including street traffic counts, accidents and publicly identified intersection issues were reviewed and analyzed and compared to future transportation plans. The TIP and MTP projects lists were examined for correlation with the new data. SEARPC continued its participation and involvement in the Arkansas Highway Safety Improvement Program.

On the local side, staff continued to push for the Hazel Street (hospital access) widening and improvements. New development in the Street scape project includes the city of Pine Bluff taking ownership of 13 blocks from the highway department and draft of plans to take the project from 4th Avenue to 8th Avenue. SEARPC coordinated the development and adoption of Pine Bluff's Comprehensive Plan and is currently working on the implementation plan. Staff reviewed all new developments (commercial) through the plan review process for projects within the MPO area and continues to write reviews and recommendations for Pine Bluff and White Hall Planning Commissions.

Transit related activities include assistance with Pine Bluff Transit's Triennial review, RFQ development for maintenance and insurance and project development. The project development included assistance with shelter location, vehicle procurement and a transit transfer facility location, Ridership reviews were conducted at both Pine Bluff Transit and Southeast Arkansas Transportation (SEAT).

44.25 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

This work task includes the Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP) development, project selection, plan monitoring and publication of the Annual List of Obligated Projects (ALOP). This category relies heavily on coordination with ArDOT for development of the Transportation Improvement Program. Information for the 2023-2026 TIP was developed and provided to the MPO's. Working with ArDOT a preliminary project list was updated for inclusion in the 2023-2026 Transportation Improvement Plan. Development of the 2023-2026 TIP did not get completed in FY2022 and will be carried forward into FY2023. A review of Performance Measures and status of projects was completed.

The 2021 Annual List of Projects (ALOP) was prepared and published.
